## Annual Call for Nominees to Serve on Farm Bureau Board

Each year, in accordance with the bylaws of the DuPage County Farm Bureau, qualified Regular (MM) Members are given the opportunity to submit their names for consideration as nominees to fill the three positions on the Board of Directors elected for a three-year term. Qualified Regular (MM) Members are those who have a substantial financial interest in the production of agricultural products and are engaged in agricultural production as a farm owner or operator, per the membership guidelines of this Farm Bureau. Regular members interested in serving, who meet the qualifications for director, are encouraged to contact the Executive Director at

their earliest convenience to discuss the nomination procedure.

### **Qualifications for a director are as follows: Article III, Section 2, Qualifications**

A member of the Board of Directors must be a voting member of this Farm Bureau in good standing and must, at the time of his or her election, be a resident of the county or have substantial farming interests located within the county, and must be eligible to hold office under the provisions of Article II, Section 1 of these bylaws.

For the purpose of making nominations to the Board of Directors, the county-at-large shall be regarded as the unit of

representation. All decisions regarding the qualifications of candidates will be made by the Board of Directors. All of the incumbents are eligible for re-election.

Nomination forms are available at the Farm Bureau Office in Carol Stream for qualified voting members interested in having their name placed in nomination. Said members are asked to contact the Executive Director, who will provide the necessary form upon request, and assist applicants with its completion. No qualified voting member may be nominated without his or her permission, and the submission of this form.

Responsibilities of those elected as members of the Board of Directors include attendance at the

regular monthly board meetings, participation on at least one standing committee and on special committees as required,

attendance at IFB District Meetings, and participation in other volunteer activities conducted by Farm Bureau to promote agriculture and improve the profitability of farming in Illinois.

**If you are interested in submitting your name for nomination, your application must be in the Farm Bureau Office no later than Noon, Friday, September 11, 2020.**

### *Roasted Beet and Citrus Salad with Mustard Vinaigrette*

Yield: 6 side servings

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 3 small red beets, peeled and sliced into 6 wedges each
- 3 small golden beets, peeled
- 4-5 cups mixed greens
- 1 blood orange, peel removed and sliced into rounds
- 2 valencia oranges, peel removed and thinly sliced into rounds
- 1 ruby red grapefruit, peel removed and thinly sliced into rounds
- 1 fennel bulb, shaved
- 2-3 tablespoons pistachios, coarsely chopped
- Optional: 2-3 tablespoons microgreens
- 1 tablespoon dijon or honey mustard
- 1 tablespoon apple cider vinegar
- ¼ cup olive oil plus more for coating the beets
- 1 teaspoon salt
- ½ teaspoon freshly ground black pepper

#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

- Preheat the oven to 400°F.
- Toss the beets in a couple of tablespoons of olive oil. Place the beets on a foil-lined baking sheet and roast for about 45 minutes, or until tender when pierced with a fork. Let cool.
- Layer together the mixed greens, beets, orange and grapefruit slices, and shaved fennel.
- Whisk together the mustard, vinegar, olive oil, salt, and pepper. Drizzle over the vegetables.
- Sprinkle with pistachios and microgreens, and serve.

## Women's Corner by Carol Bohnert

Where would you go for a leisurely stroll to view a series of community gardens? Would your chosen location include a picturesque butterfly garden? One possible location to visit is the DuPage County fairgrounds. Yes, the same area that normally would be bustling with activities, exhibits, animals, carnival rides, and food vendors complete with the pineapple twist ice cream stand, now offers beautifully landscaped fairgrounds. It features a designated flower garden as well as other allocated plots that are producing food to share with the community.

The still-evolving project of gardens at the DuPage County fairgrounds began about four years ago. The abandoned horse show

area was transformed into a walk-through flower garden. Several varieties of milkweed were planted to attract monarch butterflies, and a host of flowering plants for the pollinators and a large spread of sunflowers for feeding the ever-present bird population were planted.

About two years ago the



garden idea expanded to include a community garden. When production began, the community was invited to harvest the produce for personal use, all free of charge. Additionally, local food pantries in the Wheaton area were also supplied with produce from the garden. The garden vision continued to expand. Thus, more small plots were established. Crops such as corn,

around the priority task of harvest, an easier feat this year now that COVID-19 has cleared the calendar.

The local agriculture festival is canceled. The kids' fall sports seasons are postponed. And the 7th grader and freshman in our household will start the school year 100% remotely, making high-speed internet and mobile hotspots a necessity. Remote will reach another level if the kids take their studies along during harvest with me on Snakeden Road, a middle-of-nowhere gravel road as winding as its name implies.

Similarly, harvest provides a time for schooling on the farm. In fact, this season may teach us more about the production impacts of planting decisions than the

beans and peppers were added to the growing list. A berry plot, a grape arbor and a young orchard give credence to the vision of serving the community well into the future. The fair staff and volunteers have created a park-like environment that is inviting people to stroll through the gardens, bike on the trails, or enjoy a picnic by the butterfly garden.

The "serving the community" vision was still embedded in the minds of the fair board personnel even when COVID-19 caused the 2020 annual fair to be cancelled – no rodeo, no nighttime entertainment, no demolition derby. The fair board, thus, wrestled with the question of "What are the needs of the community this year?" Food needs became an obvious answer. Resulting in action from the fairgrounds staff, board members, and other volunteers to create another community garden. The

last several have. The crop struggled at its start in undesirably cool soil temperatures, fitting of the mood of the COVID-19 pandemic at the time. The economic shutdowns combined with decisions about when to plant made this spring as stressful as the unprecedented planting season last year.

We need a mental reprieve, a feeling of normalcy, and objectives that we can see and achieve. Harvest season brings attainable goals we can check off field by field.

Farm families everywhere can relate to the long hours and natural isolation to gather the harvest. Together, we share satisfaction in productive harvest days and empathize with mechanical breakdowns that derail

infield of the grandstand became the chosen location. Volunteers tilled the heavily compacted soil and prepared the seedbed. Neighbors, friends of the fair, as well as the grounds keeping department at Cantigny donated seeds and plants for the new garden. The fair staff planted what was given. Additional harvesting of produce from the newest garden area is now in process. Squash, beans, peppers, and tomatoes are among the produce available, free of charge to the community. The produce is also being taken to four local pantries at Milton Township, Wayne Township, Resurrection Church pantries, and People's Resource Center for distribution to people dealing with food insecurity at this time.

As Jim McGuire, the Executive Manager of the fairgrounds, states, "The fairgrounds are here to be part of the community." Before COVID-19 caused can-
