




Ag in the Classroom Teacher Grants

"Down on the Farm"

Breanna Struss – Glen Crest Elementary, Glen Ellyn – 4th-6th Special Ed

Over the course of a month, Breanna's students learned about farming and different types of farm animals. Students engaged in hands-on activities, watched animal videos, and created a classroom barn. For their science class, the students studied seven farm animals and learned about the products that each animal gives us, where they live, and their characteristics. During their study of each animal, the class did a craft and made a snack, such as scrambling eggs and making homemade butter. Breanna used her grant funds to purchase craft materials and snack ingredients. At the end of the farm unit, the students were tested on their animal knowledge and created a farm quilt for their barn.



"Vermicomposting with Worm Bins"

Lisa Burnell – Horizon Elementary, Hanover Park – 4th Grade

Using the funds from the AITC grant and other donations, Lisa's class purchased two worm composters and 250 worms. Due to the pandemic, students were unable to be involved with the set-up process of the worm bins. Throughout this unit, students learned about and discussed compostable and non-compostable materials and the importance of recycling. This program was an enhancement to the school's already existing recycling program. Students were able to help harvest some of the worm castings which were used in the school's vertical gardening area. Next fall, the school plans to start a garden club to help manage the compostable materials from the lunchroom and expand the worm farm from this project.

Ag Spotlight: Meet Chris Saad—Honey Trails Honey, LLC

As a carpenter/contractor by trade, beekeeping and producing honey started as a hobby that Chris Saad fell into. When the housing market crashed in 2008, Chris found his business suffering. He always had a love of agriculture, so caring for bees and offering assembled hive components seemed like a great plan. "It allowed me to put my carpentry skills to use," said Chris. His business not only offers local, raw, and unfiltered honey and pure beeswax, which they use in handmade candles and skin-care products, but the woodenware to house bees, as well as bee packages and queens.

Chris and his wife, Bernadette, own and operate all aspects of the business out of their home in Wayne. While Chris' specialty is the woodworking portion, Bernadette carefully crafts the handmade candles and skincare products. Their sons

also help out part-time. He built his business from the ground up and hopes someone will continue with it when he eventually retires.

in an assortment of flavors. The nectar source changes the flavors throughout the year. The four flavors they sell include: Spring blossom – a delicate flavored honey, Linden honey – available early in the season in June which has a citrus tone, Clover Wildflower – a mix of wildflowers available in July, and Goldenrod – a uniquely flavored honey, bold, dark, strong and has a caramel/butterscotch flavor.

Timing is a big factor in the honey production. Chris explains, "Spring start up and harvest seasons are the most difficult times of the year. It's a shaky business that continues to get more

ing with the bees is pretty special and the people we've met along the way" is the most satisfying part of the business.

Honey Trails produces honey in several forms; cream, liquid, combs, and wax products. Those include candles, and skin care products that use honey or beeswax. The honey also comes

Hot fact: Illinois No. 1 in horseradish

As a kid, I only knew horseradish as the white, hot condiment that Mom enjoyed on her roast beef sandwich. As an adult, I learned a cool fact about the vegetable with sinus-clearing heat: Illinois ranks No. 1 in horseradish production. Farmers in southwest Illinois grow two-thirds of the nation's supply, easily winning the horse(radish) race with more than double the acreage of No. 2 California.

Illinois' horseradish reign can add some flavor to picnic table talk and even the picnic food itself, appropriate during July, dubbed National Horseradish Month. Squirt some prepared horseradish on a hot dog.

Are you looking for a great way to spice up any meal? Consider horseradish! Illinois proudly ranks as the highest producing state for horseradish. In fact, Collinsville, Illinois is known as the "Horseradish Capital of the World," and supplies roughly 60% of the world's horseradish. Enjoy this delicious recipe sure to wow your tastebuds!



HORSERADISH CHICKEN TACOS Recipe

Illinois proudly ranks as the highest producing state for horseradish. In fact, Collinsville, Illinois is known as the "Horseradish Capital of the World," and supplies roughly 60% of the world's horseradish.



Add it to the picnic meat-loaf. Shave some raw root onto a tossed salad. People even toast the vegetable in Bloody Mary cocktails during a competition at the International Horseradish Festival in Collinsville, where festivalgoers also hurl roots for sport.

Noticeably different from Illinois' dominant landscape of corn and soybeans, horseradish is a root crop. Its above-ground leaves resemble oversized, three-foot-tall greens. Its white root delivers the heat desired in condiments and popular on prime rib. Rob Gerstenecker's family has grown horseradish for around 50 years near the Mississippi River basin, the "American Bottoms" where the crop thrives in the rich soils and climate.

Horseradish production delivers another set of busy seasons for the Gersteneckers, also corn and soybean farmers. Before corn and soybean planting, they plant and harvest final horseradish roots in early spring. After corn and soybean harvest, they harvest most of their

roots, then clean and pack roots through the end of the year, saving quality finger roots for "seed" to plant the following year.

Each root is planted, weeded, harvested and packed by hand (I repeat, by hand), making the crop's labor demands as intense as its heat. The family hires extra hands to help, and Rob estimates one day of work in the field equals up to three days of work in the shed to prepare roots for shipment to the farm's buyers, which include processors in Maryland and Ohio.

During the growing

season, farmers hire Rob to scout for bugs and diseases in horseradish fields, including in the top-producing counties of Madison, St. Clair and Monroe. At home, his family enjoys horseradish in spaghetti sauces and on meats off the grill. For the amateur, he suggests adding horseradish to foods enjoyed with onions to taste test and support Illinois' hot crop.

INGREDIENTS

Taco Ingredients

- 2 large sweet onions, thinly sliced
- 2 tbsp. plus 1 tsp. extra virgin olive oil, divided
- 4 skinless, boneless chicken breasts, cut into strips
- 1 tsp. cumin
- 1 tsp. coriander
- 1 tsp. freshly ground pepper
- 8 (8-inch) multigrain tortillas
- 2 cups baby spinach

DIRECTIONS

1. Heat 2 tablespoons olive oil in a large skillet over high heat. Add onions and sauté for 5 minutes. Add red pepper and sauté another 5 minutes, until onions are translucent, and the peppers have softened. Remove from heat and set aside.
2. Season chicken strips with cumin, coriander and black pepper.
3. Heat remaining 1 teaspoon oil in a large nonstick skillet over medium heat. Cook strips 3 to 4 minutes on each side or until no longer pink.
4. Meanwhile, whisk together sauce ingredients in a medium bowl. Warm tortillas according to package instructions.
5. Place ¼ cup spinach over each tortilla. Divide chicken evenly over spinach. Top with onion, peppers and horseradish sauce.
