Follow a Farmer: June Activities

Whew! It's been a busy month here on the farm! At the end of May we opened to the public for our U-Pick strawberry season. Customers came from all over central Illinois to pick their fill of our delicious strawberries. On Memorial Day we had around 500 people come pick berries in the morning! That is a record number! In the past we would pre-picked strawberries with a

full crew of employees to fill orders, but in the last few years we've transitioned to only offering u-pick, and it's been working well for us. We had a great season with good weather most days and a great crop. We ended our strawberry season around the middle of June. Now that we are officially open, we've also opened our small bakery at the store. We bake a small array of cookies,

muffins, and other treats for our customers to buy with their berries. YUM! We also finished picking asparagus for orders and let it go to seed. Then we mowed off the asparagus to "clean cut" it and apply weed control. Asparagus is a perennial plant, so we don't have to replant it. Additionally, we finished planting our corn and soybeans and baled our first cutting of alfalfa hay

which we will use as feed for our cattle. Coming up in July we have our next berry season: blueberries!

This amazing crop is used in thousands of household products, as animal feed, and biofuel. For our project, each student made a paper greenhouse and germinated soybean seeds using a moist cotton ball. We've also been busy setting up summer lessons with local libraries and park districts! Its going to be a fun summer of in-person learning!

2022 Teacher Grant Winners

This year 5 teachers in DuPage County received grants to fund an agriculture project with their students in the spring semester. Check out what they've been up to!

Butterfield Garden Club

Rebecca Nelson and Jeanne Brasel from Butterfield Elementary in Lombard used their grant to purchase gardening materials for their garden club. The club had 38 K-5th students who met weekly. For their project the students planned a garden and learned about plant lifecycles and how to harvest plants. They collaborated with their peers to create three garden plans with the themes of Disney, Mario Party, and Rainbow. The students chose plants that went with their theme and planted them in raised beds.



Indoor LED Plant Habitats

Dana Berning from Glenn Westlake Middle School used her grant to purchase indoor plant stands, grow lights and gardening supplies for her 7th graders. The students planted their seeds and charted the type of light and soil used. Their goal was to see what type of lighting and soil/fertilizer worked best for each plant. They grew flowers, fruits, vegetables and saw the difference in success rates of fertilizing the plants.



Botany – Hydroponics & Terrariums

Lori Tobolski's 5th grade class from Manor Hill Elementary in Lombard learned about alternative ways to grow plants using aquaponics and hydroponics and explored how pollution affects ground water and plant growth. With the grant they purchased a hydroponics system, aquaponic fish tank, stones, sand, and soil. The students were able to grow their seeds using these unconventional methods and see how food is grown.



Service Garden

Anna Pagdin's 5th grade class from Sacred Heart School in Lombard used their grant to expand the school's service garden that was started last year. The students purchased gardening materials and hand tools to grow a variety of fruits and vegetables. They met directly with food pantry volunteers and will drop off the produce this summer. This project gave the students a firsthand experience with philanthropy and gardening.

Earth Club


Krista Lipnisky from Washington Elementary in Wheaton used the grant to purchase gardening supplies and teach her 4th grade class about growing plants. The students grew flowers from seeds and transplanted them into pots to beautify their quad area. They also grew vegetable seeds for their garden. The seeds were started indoors and moved outside when the weather warmed. The students were able to take home flowers and some vegetables at the end of the year.

The Farmer's Almanac Predictions – July 2022

Sky Watch: Earth reaches its annual solar far point, or aphelion, on the 4th. In the predawn eastern sky, the lineup is still happening, but Mercury is now lower and harder to see, and the other planets are now farther apart and less eye-catching. After the 4th, Mercury is too low to see, but Saturn, rising a half hour earlier each week, now comes up by 11 p.m., with Jupiter, in Pisces, following the Ringed Planet to appear low in the east after midnight. Both giant planets are now at their highest at dawn. Mars, too, is gaining visibility at a very bright magnitude 0.3, as it rises at 2 a.m. in Aries. Planet viewing has now shifted from the exclusively predawn stage of winter

and spring to summers middle-of-the-night venue.

Weather: Temp. 72.5 degrees (2 degrees above avg.); precip. 3.5" (avg.). 1-14 A few t-storms, turning hot. 15-21 T-storms, then sunny, cool. 22-31 T-storms, warm.

No Bake Summer Berry Icebox Cake

Looking for a quick and easy Summer dessert recipe? Try out delicious No Bake Summer Berry Icebox Cake!

Total time: 4 hours 15 mins • Serves: 12-16

Ingredients

- 19 oz graham crackers
- 8 oz cream cheese, softened
- 2 (3.4 oz) packages vanilla instant pudding
- 2-1/2 cups cold milk
- 12 oz Cool Whip (or homemade whipped cream)
- 3 cups fresh strawberries, sliced
- 1-1/2 cups fresh blueberries
- 2 oz white chocolate chips

Instructions

Beat cream cheese and dry pudding mixes in large bowl with mixer until blended.

Gradually beat in milk.

Gently stir in Cool Whip or homemade whipped cream, reserving 1/2 cup.

Spread a thin layer of cool whip in a 9x13 pan just to coat the bottom.

Layer 5 graham crackers across the center of the pan, then 2 more, breaking them as needed to fit around the top and bottom edges.

Spread a layer of pudding mixture over grahams and top with a layer of blueberries and sliced strawberries.

Place graham crackers on top of berries, then pudding mixture, then layer of berries again.

Repeat the graham-pudding-berries layers 1 more time (3 times total) and you should reach the top of the pan.

Refrigerate for at least 4 hours or overnight until the graham crackers have softened completely.

When ready to serve, melt white chocolate chips in a bowl as directed on package and drizzle over dessert.

You can use a spoon to drizzle it over the tops of the berries or you can put it into a small zip-top bag and snip of the corner for an easy "piping bag."

Pesticides support food security

More often than wars, global trade disputes or extreme weather events, insects, diseases and weeds threaten the nation's food supply with relentless consistency, season after season.

Beetles eat corn silks, preventing full pollination of the ears. Stem rust disease can devastate wheat production. Weeds compete with food crops for the same air, sunlight, soil nutrients and moisture. We have a variety of tools to reduce the impact of these pests, with world crop losses already estimated at 40% lost to weeds, insects and diseases, according to the United Nations.

Without pesticides, that loss could double.

Pesticides, sometimes called chemicals and crop protection products, are crit-

ical to attaining a plentiful, affordable and diverse food supply, especially significant when fewer than 2% of people grow food for 100% of the population. Conventional and organic farmers alike have pesticides in their arsenal, whether man-made or naturally derived to kill pests, including insecticides for insects, fungicides for diseases and herbicides for weeds. And those products are taken seriously to ensure safety.

Pesticides are tested and approved: FDA, USDA and EPA test each product and must deem them safe before allowing commercial use.

Applicators must be licensed: More often than a license to drive, farmers and hired applicators routinely train and take an exam to attain mandatory certification before allowed to buy and apply the products.

Farmers try to use less: About 95% of the spray tank is water and only about a soda can's worth of active ingredient is applied across an acre, equivalent to the size of a football field. Changes in farming practices, such as adoption of GMOs has reduced my farm's

insecticide use by half in the last 25 years while producing nearly 50% more corn per acre. In recent years, we have adopted cover crops, which helps control weeds to reduce herbicide needs.

Likewise, advancements in the technology to apply pesticides makes their use more accurate and effective than ever. As one of the most technologically advanced pieces of equipment on the farm, modern sprayers have automatic

flow controls and shutoffs, droplet size adjustments, spray pattern variations and available sensors to scan crop health and weed infestations. Applicators pair these features with guidance technology and an in-cab computer system to prevent over-application, minimize off-target movement and enhance precision in placement and quantity, all to attain the goal of allowing food crops to thrive.
