Illinois Farm Families Featured in Super Bowl ad

A Mercer County farm family was featured in a commercial that aired on Feb. 12, during the first half of this weekend's big game. Chad Bell, his wife Brittany, and children Amelia and Charlie, appeared in the commercial, titled "The Corporation," to bring aware-

ness of Illinois' family-owned farms.

"We're very honored to be part of this campaign," said Chad Bell, a sixth-generation farmer who, along with his family, raises pigs, corn, soybeans, hay and wheat on their Viola farm. "I'm still wrapping my head around the fact that my

family was chosen to be part of it. I'm really happy to be somebody who can help promote Illinois farm families and do what I can to help others realize that we are the family farm and we're still alive and kicking."

The commercial, produced by the Illinois Farm Families (IFF) coalition, marks the launch of the coalition's "We are the 96%" campaign. The campaign features more than 25 farm families across the state with the goal to make IIlinoisans aware that 96%

of farms in the state are operated by families like the Bells.

Six other farm families appeared in the commercial alongside the Bells: the Gould family, of Kane County, the Heap family, of Kendall County, the No-

> land family, of Macon County, the Sanderson family of Dekalb County, the Marr family, of Morgan County, and the Kleinschmidt family, of Logan and Tazewell County. The commercial aired during the first half of the Super Bowl LVII in the Champaign, Peoria-Bloomington, Rockford,

Springfield, St. Louis, and the Ouad Cities markets.

"There's a big misconception in agriculture that the family farm is gone and everything now is corporate farming and things aren't the way it used to be," said Bell. "Yes, farming has changed. Farms have gotten larger and there are fewer farmers, but in the end, the vast majority of farms are still made up of families, even if they look a little different today."

Bell said that the best part of farming is taking

> his kids along while he works

on the farm and watching them learn the importance of agriculture.

The Bell family has been farming in eastern Mercer County since the 1960s. Chad Bell continues working on his family's farm alongside his father, Greg Bell, who is semi-retired but still plays a strong support role on the farm. Chad Bell is responsible for the daytoday decisions on the farm.

The Bell family, along with the other families featured throughout the "We are the 96" campaign, will be profiled on the campaign website, Wearethe96. org. Visitors can view behind-the-scenes footage and learn more about each family, their history on the farm and what their farm looks like today. All families participating will be featured on Illinois Farm Families social media, including Facebook, Instagram and YouTube accounts.

Following the on-air debut, the full commercial can be viewed on Illinois Farm Families' Facebook page and Wearethe96.org.

"It's a humbling feeling to know that together with my wife and family we were asked to be involved in this," said Bell. "Helping showcase Illinois family farmers is not easily describable; but being part of the Illinois family farmers - it's amazing."



General Scholarships

Four \$2,000 scholarships may be awarded to eligible high school seniors pursing a degree related to the agriculture industry. Qualifying majors may include: Biology, Chemistry, Pre-vet, Horticulture, Communications, Business, etc. Applicants must explain how they will use their major in the agricul-

ture industry. Applications are due April 1st, 2023. Arnold Oestmann Scholarships

Four \$1,500 scholarships may be awarded to high school seniors intending to further their education at a college, university, or technical school. There is no restriction on the course of study. Applications are due May 1st, 2023.

Culinary and Nutrition Scholarship

One \$1,000 to \$2,000 scholarship may be awarded to a high school senior, or

college freshman, sophomore, or junior pursing a degree in the culinary arts or nutrition. Applications are due May 1st, 2023.

Ken F. Ebersold Scholarship

Two \$2,000 scholar-ship may be awarded to an eligible college freshman, sophomore, or junior who is actively and successfully pursuing an undergraduate degree in an agricultural related course of study. 

The Farmer's Almanac Predictions – March 2023

Sky Watch:

On the 1st, Venus and Jupiter are breathtakingly close to each other, low in the west 40 minutes after sunset, creating the year's finest conjunction. On the 2nd, they're visibly separating. During March, Jupiter sinks lower while Venus climbs a bit higher each evening. The crescent Moon dangles below Venus on the 23rd and above it on the 24th. Also on the 24th, binocular users can look for green planet Uranus to the left of the Moon. Since there are no green stars, the color should make it easily identifiable. On the 28th, look for the Moon to hover just above fading Mars. They're part of the impressive gathering of stars and planets that surround Orion in the southwest at nightfall. Spring begins with the vernal equinox on the evening of the 20th at 5:24pm. EDT. March 2023

Temperature 37 degrees (1 below average); precipitation 3" (average). 1-4 Sunny, cold. 5-21 Periods of rain and snow, chilly. 22-27 Isolated showers, mild. 28-31 Rainy periods; cool east, warm west.



Ingredients:

1/4 lb. asparagus (about half bunch), trimmed and cut into 2-inch pieces

3 cups mixed greens 15 oz. can chickpeas, rinsed and drained

1 cup grape tomatoes, halved 2 Persian cucumbers, halved and sliced

1/2 cup red onion, diced 1/2 cup kalamata olives, pitted 1/3 cup feta cheese, crumbled For the Dressing:

3 tablespoons olive oil Juice from ½ lemon

1/4 teaspoon dried oregano

1/4 teaspoon salt (or to taste)
1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper (or to

¼ teaspoon ground black pepper (or to taste)

Directions:

Bring a medium pot of salted water to a boil and add asparagus. Cook for 2 minutes, then remove with a slotted spoon and place in a bowl of ice water. Let cool, then drain. In a large bowl, combine mixed greens, asparagus chickpeas, tomatoes, cucumbers, red onion, cucumber, olives and feta cheese.

In a small bowl, make the dressing by whisking together olive oil, lemon juice, oregano, salt, and pepper.

Pour dressing over the salad and toss to combine. Add more salt and black pepper to taste.



Farming: A job with as many boots as hats

Before the first puddles of spring arrived, I would rummage through the supply of hand-me-down rubber boots, searching for the size that our young kids had grown into for the season. The appropriate footwear lined the back hall, ready for water to pond in the driveway.

Today, my teenagers splash less, but the boot dryer has a permanent space near an outlet and the family's boots now take up more space for a household with adult-sized feet. Shoes

and boots for "farm" and "good" fill cabinets and cubbies by the back door. Rubber boots – both insulated and not – line part of the garage wall. Shelves display the nicer western boots that our kids wear to school, FFA events and the 4-H fair for showing livestock. Boots for the chicken coop stay in the garage.

Farmers wear as many boots as hats on the farm, symbolic of a wide range of skills worth recognizing in this season that honors National Ag Day on March 21, 2023. In Illinois, families (not corporations) own and operate an overwhelming 96% of farms. Those families pull on boots as agronomists, veterinarians, accountants and mechanics. They operate heavy machinery, manage employees, build fence and monitor weather to know what boots to wear.

In this job of many boots,

we may scout bean fields on a dewy summer morning or clean a livestock stall for the next cow to give birth. Hard-soled boots climb from the tractor to check seed depth behind the planter. We attend farm conferences in our best boots or spend a winter afternoon with the family in snow boots, sledding the slope southeast of the farmstead.

For some farms, plastic boot covers protect animals from devastating diseases that could transmit from boot treads. That's not the case for us but boot covers would help at times. Someone occasionally leaves a trail of mud in the farm of-

fice, despite the boot scraper outside the door.

Three boot dryers await their duties along the footwear wall where Dad and the guys store boots for every season and task, from chores to cheer – or sometimes, the unexpected. I wore rubber boots to my aunt's funeral a few years ago to keep my heels out of the mud. It was my nod to the career farm woman, who would have done the same.


IL Ag in the Classroom 'Show Us Your Boots' Campaign

55M USDA Grant Funds Illinois-led Innovative Cover Cropping Project

The U.S. Department of Agriculture recently announced that it is funding a new project led by the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign that will address major obstacles to adoption of cover crops in the United States.

Titled "iCOVER: Innovated Cover-crop Opportunity, Verification, and Economy stimulating technology for underserved farmers using Robotics," this \$4,999,999, four-year project is funded through the USDA's Partnerships for Climate-Smart Commodities program and

was facilitated through the Institute for Sustainability, Energy, and Environment at Illinois. The project will scale up robotic cover crop planting and verification of soil carbon through innovative radiological robotic sensing technologies, creating markets for climate-smart products for minority underserved farmers growing specialty crops and animal products.

"Cover cropping is hugely beneficial to farmers and the environment by ensuring more carbon in the soil year-round, keeping nutrients where they belong and out of the atmosphere," said Primary Investigator Girish Chowdhary, Associate Professor of Agricultural & Biological Engineering and Computer Science.
"But there are three major bottlenecks in cover-crop adoption: high cost and hassle of planting; slow and expensive soil carbon mea-

surements; and low return on investment for

"iCOVER will scale up autonomous farming and sensing technologies to help reduce the cost and labor burden of cover crop planting, to enable accurate, rapid, low-cost soil measurements, and to explore the market linkages for climatesmart benefits to a diversity of farmers."
