Farms prep for next busy season

We hadn't started changing oil in the tractors, backhoe nor skid steer yet, and our 15-year-old expressed concern. I explained that his favorite, after-school activity in the farm shop was on hold until after the two weekends of extended-family Christmas parties that cleared the space and prompted a deep clean for a holiday potluck, gift opening and gymnasiumstyle fun on the farm.

Soon enough, maintenance work will dirty the shop floor and oil absorbency granules will be our son's best friend. Most of our farm's equipment will rotate

through the shop this winter for oil changes, inspections and replacement of highwear parts. Planters will unfold for row-by-row examination, part replacements and technology upgrades. The hay baler, mowers and even the small things like Mom's garden tiller make their shop presence before field work resumes in April. The goal: everything works at go time.

Our farm team appreciates the pattern of normal, eight-hour workdays with a designated lunch break between harvesting and planting crops. We take this time to regroup, recharge, market grain and move forward. In this winter season of self-evaluation, my parents,

Farmer's Almanac Predictions


Sky Watch:

The year begins with Jupiter as the sky's brightest "star," high in the southeast at nightfall, while Saturn hovers in the lower half of the southwestern sky. Saturn's glorious rings – now almost edgewise to our view - can be seen through any telescope with more than 30x magnification; observe the Ringed Planet early, as it is too low to be seen after 7:00 p.m. Earth stands closest to the Sun (at perihelion) on the 2nd at 8:00 p.m. The Moon floats above Saturn on the 13th and below it on the 14th, before forming a close conjunction with Jupiter on the 18th. In the predawn sky, Venus, in Scorpius, is best seen in the east from 6:00 to 6:30 A.M. with Mercury to its

lower left until the 27th. Both are extremely low, as is Mars when it joins Mercury on the morning of the 27th. January 2024

Temp. 24.5 degrees (2 degrees below avg. east, 5 degrees below west); precip. 3.5" (0.5 degrees above avg). 1-12 Periods of snow, heavy west; cold. 13-17 Rain and snow east, heavy snow west;

chilly. 18-27 Snowy periods, cold. 28-31 Lake snows east, sunny west; very cold.



brother and I will meet to discuss farm improvements and transition plans. Bookkeeping, balance sheets, tax planning, land leases and employee meetings quickly fill the days between conferences and meetings about farm policy, grain marketing, agronomic research and other ways to better the farm.

Dad tends to our small herd of beef cows, a daily chore most pleasant in mild winters. Otherwise, heavy snow and sub-zero winds add shoveling, scooping and thawing to the routine. Our employees haul corn from our grain bins to facilities that produce biofuel and feed co-products. They deliver soybeans, depending on the type, to various places for export, seed or use in highprotein foods.

This year will bring a combination of sticking with what works and trying something new in search of the next tried-and-true. The knowledge passed down from previous generations tells us our farm was shaped on both failures and successes, but we're always aiming for the latter. Here's hoping for a safe and successful 2024 in farm country.

IFB to host 'Rules for the Road' Trucking Seminar in Will Co.

Illinois Farm Bureau will host a series of two-hour programs focusing on transportation laws and regulations as they pertain to the agricultural industry.

Will County Farm Bureau will host one of the sessions on February 28, 2024 at 5:30 for a light meal, and program starts 6:00pm at the Will County Farm Bureau Auditorium in Joliet, IL.

The Rules for the Road Seminar will cover recent changes, as well as some of the more established but still misunderstood rules. Topics may include the USDOT Number, UCR registration, Entry Level Driver Training, farm exemptions, and driver's license classifications to name a few. In addition, one of the events will also be broadcast virtually on March 5th at 10 am. "These presentations take a closer look at the rules and provide an opportunity for farmers to ask ag-related trucking questions that they can't seem to find clear answers for," said Rodney Knittel, IFB Associate Director of Transportation and Infrastructure.



Knittel specializes in farm transportation issues and will lead the seminar series and will be joined by Illinois enforcement agencies.



IFB Members Elect New President, Vice President

Illinois Farm Bureau® (IFB) announced the election of Brian Duncan, a grain and livestock farmer from Polo, Ogle County, as the organization's 16th president, and Evan Hultine, a grain farmer from Princeton, Bureau County, as vice president. They will each serve a two-year term at the helm of the organization.

Four new members were also elected to serve two-year terms on the IFB Board of Directors. IFB is a nonprofit, membership organization directed by farmers who join through their county Farm Bureau. IFB's 329 voting delegates elected these new leaders during the organization's annual meeting in Chicago.

"This organization stands on the shoulders of giants – our farmer members – who have come before and plotted a course for this organization," said Duncan. "I look forward to navigating and charting that course along with them, our county Farm Bureaus and our board of directors into the next chapter. It is an incredible privilege to work alongside the team we have at IFB."

In his capacity as IFB president, Duncan is also president of COUNTRY Financial, Illinois Agricultural Service Company and chair of the IAA Foundation.

Previously, Duncan served as IFB vice president. He also served as president of the Ogle County Farm Bureau (CFB) from 2004-2017, and on the American Farm Bureau Federation's (AFBF) Swine Advisory Committee 2003-2006, National Pork Producers Council Price Discovery Task Force, Ogle County Pork Producers board of directors and the IFB Young Leaders Committee from 1990-1994. He was the IFB Discussion Meet winner in 1990 and Young Leader Achievement Award winner in 1999.

Duncan is a graduate of Sauk Valley Community College and an active member of Forreston Grove Presbyterian Church. He and his wife, Kelly, raise corn, soybeans,
